## MEET PRAYNIA

Ten-year-old Praynia (Pree-na) lives with her family in a remote coastal village in Solomon Islands. Like other communities, hers has always lived off the land, relying on their gardens and the sea for all their food.

But today, that food is harder to count on. Rising seas are flooding gardens, and crops are becoming less predictable. Praynia sees the adults in her community worry as vegetables grow smaller and fishing takes longer because the fish are moving further from the shore. When a cyclone hit her village, it destroyed their crops and made the food they relied on scarce.

Praynia is a top student who loves maths. She really enjoys science and English too - subjects important to fulfill her dream of becoming a doctor. But following this dream is only possible if she has good, nutritious food to grow healthy and strong. And enough of it that her family can rely on to see her through her years of learning.
